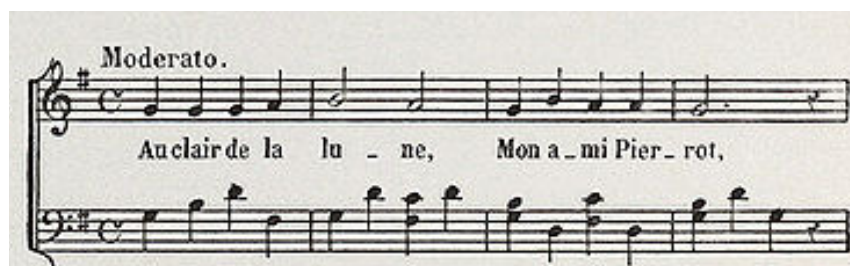


Songs for Singing and Stringing With Year 3

- Pitch patterning / Solfa
- Sing Letternames + Handstaff (do=D for strings) + String Fingering
- Sing Rhythm names too
- Read - Stick notation; Staff notation; and varying clefs (later in the year)
- TRANPOSE – for classwork and for string work

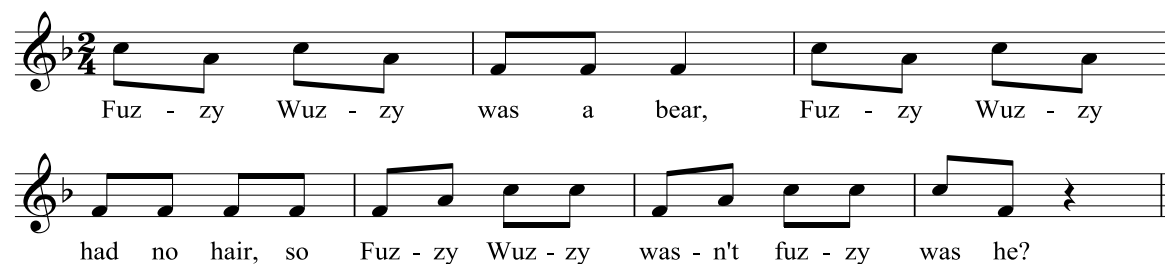


AU CLAIR DE LA LUNE

PEASE PORRIDGE HOT




Pease por-ridge hot, Pease por-ridge cold, Pease por-ridge in the pot, nine days old.
